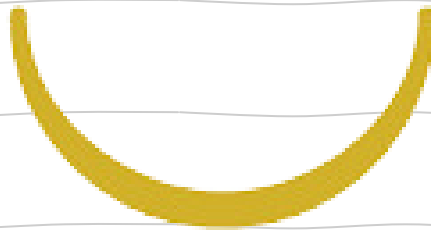


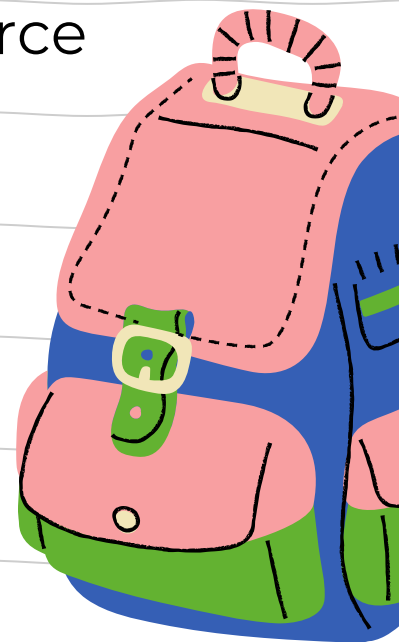

ESY is funded by Dignity Health and Medi-Cal Dental Reimbursements

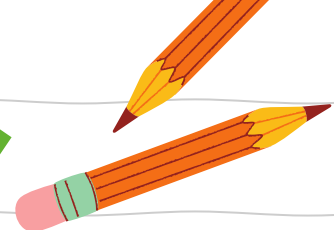
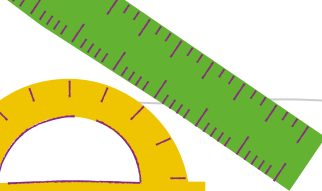
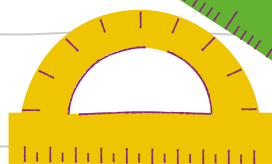
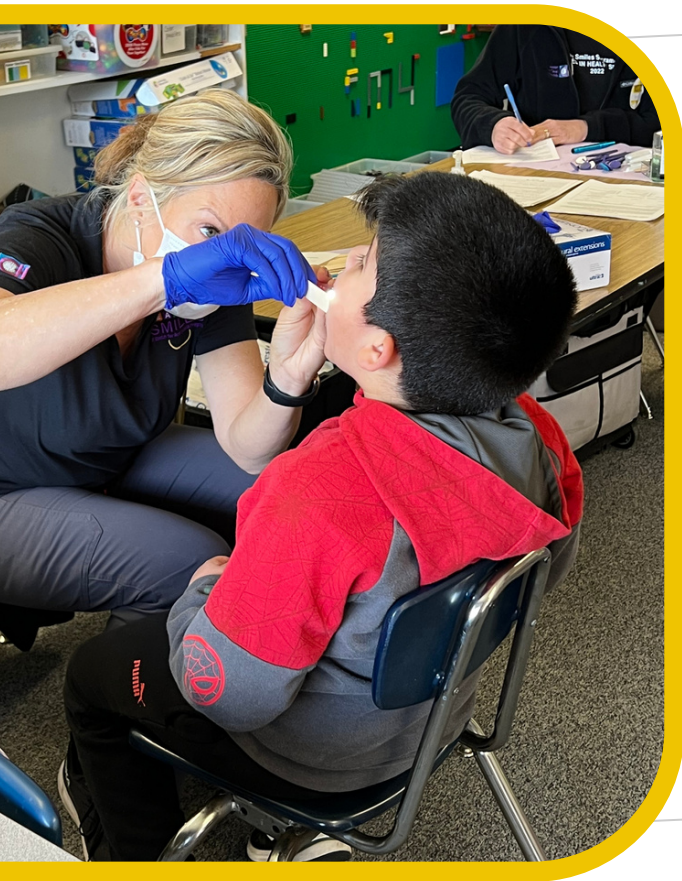

THE BURDEN OF DENTAL DISEASE

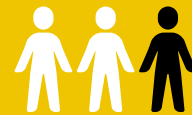
Dental caries (tooth decay) remains the most prevalent chronic disease in both children and adults, even though it is largely preventable. (1)

Tooth decay disproportionately affects low-income children and children of color in the state. Untreated tooth decay can lead to devastating academic, physical, social-emotional, and economic consequences. (2)

More than **50%** of California's Kindergarteners have experienced tooth decay. (2)



2 in 3 children are affected by tooth decay by the time they reach 3rd grade. (3)



Tooth decay is the cause of **874,000** school days missed each year, which costs schools **\$29 to \$32 million** annually in average daily attendance funding. (4)

In 2021, more than **60%** of Medi-Cal eligible recipients went without an annual dental visit in the State of California. (5)





Tooth decay is nearly *100%* preventable!

SCHEDULE IN-PERSON ORAL HEALTH EDUCATION AND DENTAL SCREENING DAY

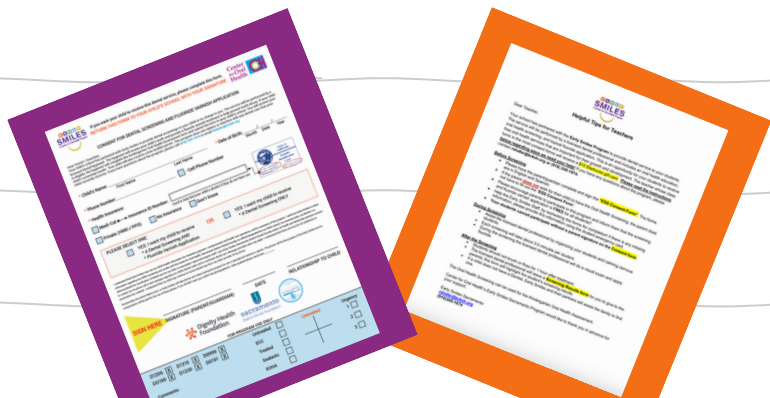
The Early Smiles Program Director will schedule your school's in-person oral health education and dental screening day.

Three weeks before dental screening day, ESY staff will provide in-person oral health education, distribute "Tips for Teachers" & distribute ESY Consents.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

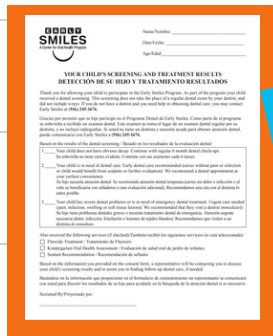
DENTAL SCREENING DAY

Registered Dental Hygienist(s), will conduct an in-depth oral health assessment (Dental Screening) for signs of untreated tooth decay. A dental screening takes **1 to 2 Mins/Student**.

If applicable, the ESY team will complete Kindergarten Oral Health Assessments (KOHA).

- If your school district has an opt-out KOHA policy, ESY will screen all kindergarteners and complete KOHA forms.
- Kindergarteners must have signed ESY Consents to receive additional services; fluoride varnish and navigation to a dental home.

Each student screened will receive an ESY Results Form and an Oral Hygiene Kit.

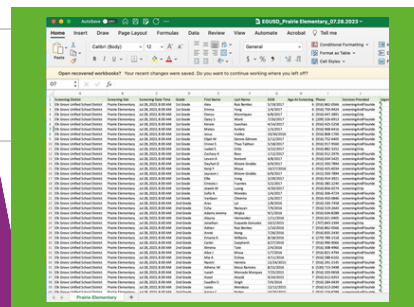
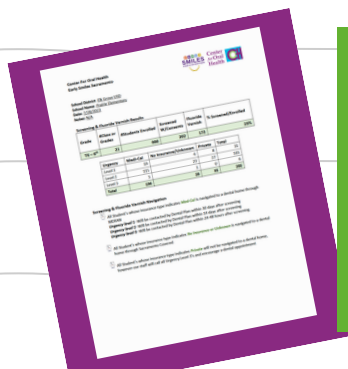


NAVIGATION & CARE COORDINATION

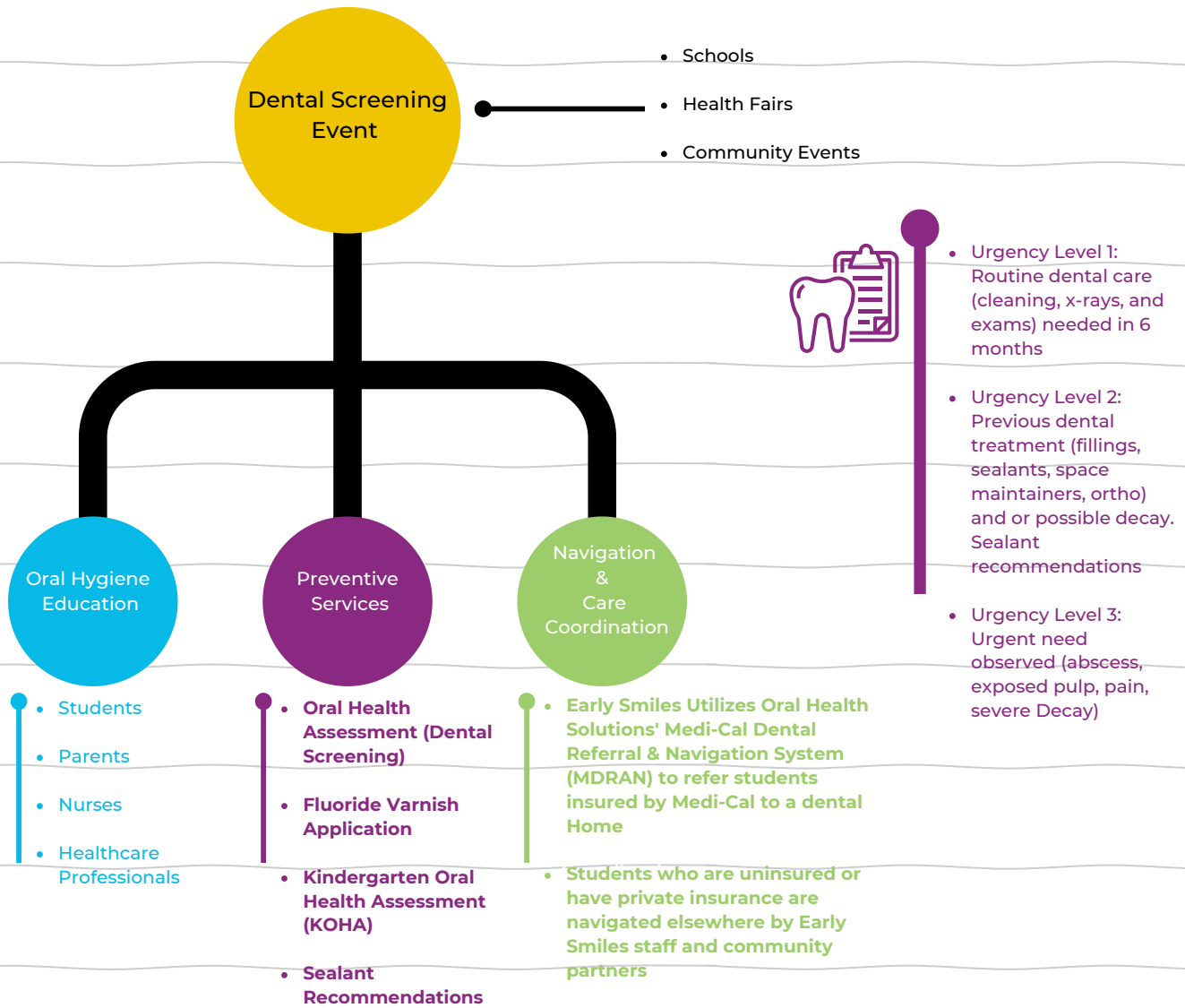
The Early Smiles Yolo program navigates **ALL** students screened, with a signed ESY consent form, to care based on insurance status.

SCHOOL REPORTS

After dental screening day, the Early Smiles Program Director will send your school an in-depth screening report.

Navigation & Care Coordination

Medi-Cal Dental Insurance

- ESY uses MDRAN to navigate students with Medi-Cal dental coverage

Private Insurance

- No referral is needed; however, ESY staff contact parents/guardians to ensure all Urgency Level 3's have a dental home

Uninsured

- ESY works with the Sacramento District Dental Society to navigate students to a dental home



- Urgency Level 1: Will be contacted within 30 days after dental screening
- Urgency Level 2: Will be contacted within 14 days after dental screening
- Urgency Level 3: Will be contacted within 24 to 48 hours after dental screening

DENTAL URGENCY SCALE

URGENCY LEVEL 1



Urgency Level 1- No Obvious Problems

- Recommend routine dental care in 6 months.
- The student will be contacted within 30 days after dental screening day to establish a dental home and or schedule a routine dental appointment.

URGENCY LEVEL 2



Urgency Level 2- Early Dental Care Needed

- Previous dental treatment, possible decay, or sealant recommendations.
- Recommend dental appointment before next routine dental visit.
- The student will be contacted within 14 days after dental screening day to establish a dental home and or schedule a dental appointment.

URGENCY LEVEL 3



Urgency Level 3- Urgent Care Needed

- Signs or symptoms that include pain, infection, or swelling.
- Recommend immediate dental care.
- The student will be contacted within 48 hours after dental screening day to establish a dental home and or schedule an emergency dental appointment.

ORAL HEALTH EDUCATION

PRESCHOOL, TK, & KINDERGARTEN

In-person oral health education is done on the same day as dental screening.

- 5 to 10 mins long
- ESY Staff will use puppets and or read book
- ESY Staff will provide oral health education in individual classrooms or in a designated location



ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE SCHOOL, & HIGH SCHOOL

Oral health education is provided in-person and done 3 weeks in advance of dental screening.

- 15 to 45 Mins Long
- ESY Staff will provide oral health education in an auditorium or blacktop setting

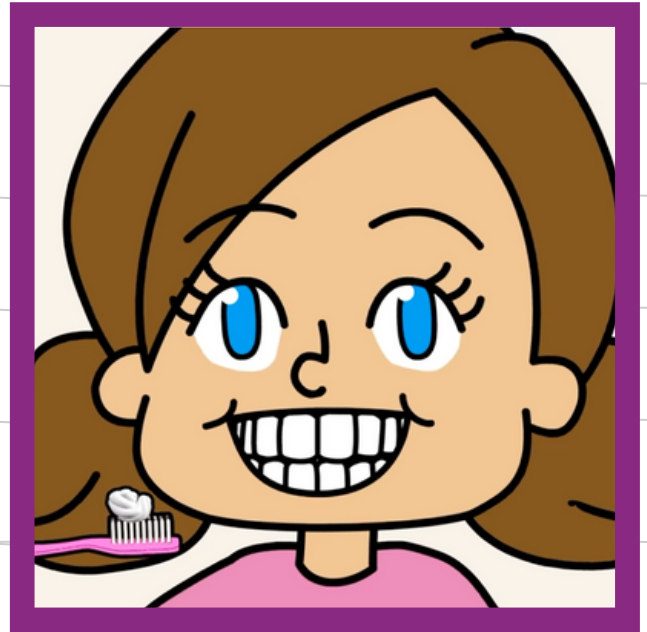

COMMUNICATION

Many schools like to make announcements to parents and teachers through social media and or online systems (Email, Blackboard, Robocalls, Etc.)

Below, are a few examples you may want to use with your parents, teachers, and students to prepare for your school's dental screening day.

TEACHER

Early Smiles Yolo will be providing a "FREE" Dental Screening and Fluoride Varnish Treatment for all students on **DATE**. Consent forms will be dropped off on **DATE** and will be placed in your mailbox. Consent forms are due and must be present (in students' hands when called out of class) on **DATE**. Please keep all returned consent forms with you until dental screening day.

Classroom incentives are encouraged to increase the consent return rate! The teacher with the most student participants will receive a gift card!! If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me via email or phone.

PARENTS

Early Smiles Yolo will be providing a "FREE" Dental Screening and Fluoride Varnish Treatment for all students on **DATE**. If you would like your student to participate, please sign their consent form and return it asap!! Students must have a signed consent form to participate in the "FREE" dental screening event.

Students who participate will receive a free hygiene kit with a toothbrush, floss, toothpaste, and a 2-minute timer!

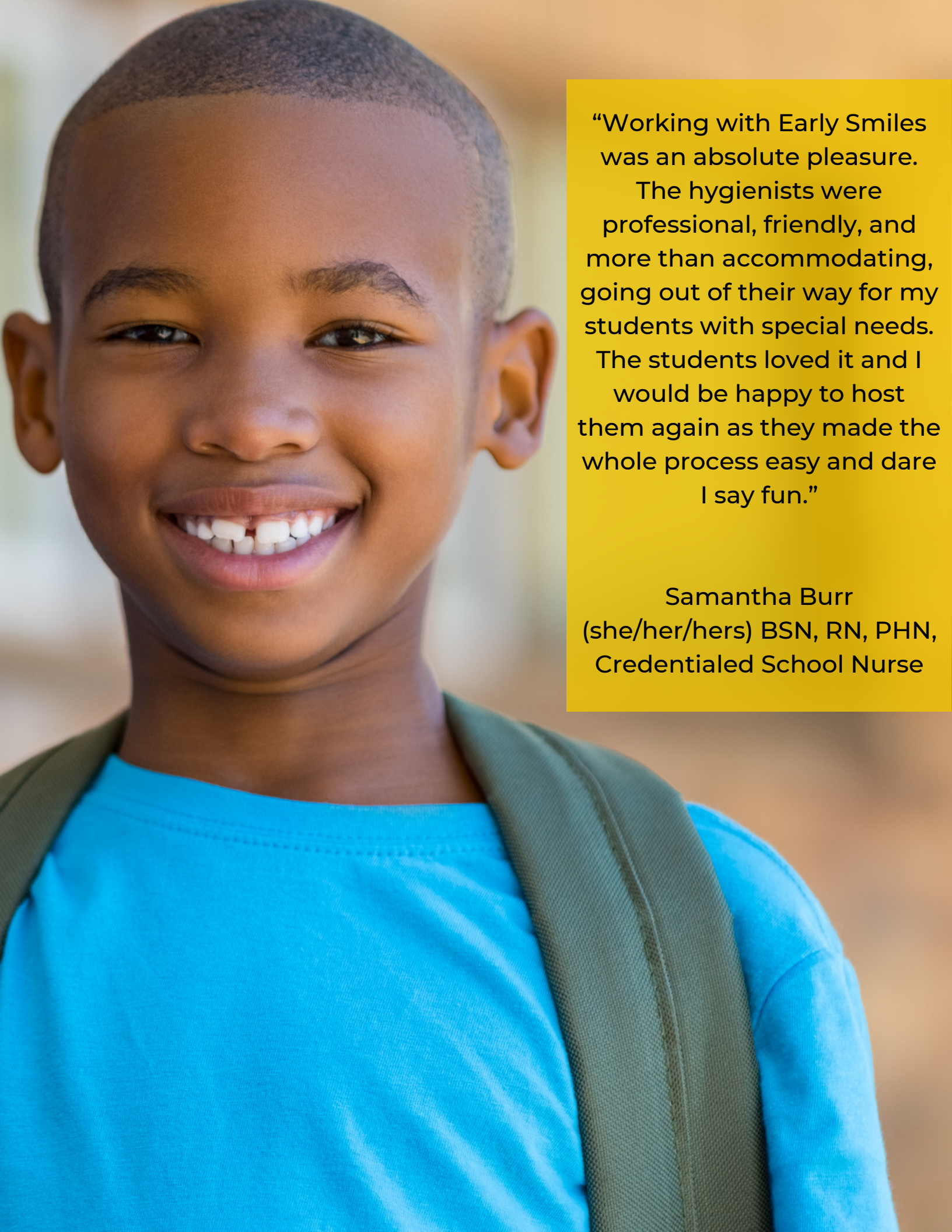
PARENTS-KINDERGARTEN OPT-OUT

In 2017, Senate Bill 379 (SB 379) passed that allows schools to use passive consent for Kindergarten Oral Health Assessments (KOHA). Passive consent requires parents to notify, in writing, if they do NOT want their child to receive an assessment. Early Smiles Yolo will be providing dental screenings and completing the KOHA form for kindergarteners at **SCHOOL NAME** on **DATE**.

If you want your child to participate in the "FREE" Dental Screenings for his/her grade, **NO** further action is required.

If you want your child to receive a "FREE" Dental Screening, Fluoride Varnish Treatment (teeth vitamins), and navigation to a dental home, please fill out the Early Smiles Yolo consent form that was sent home with your student.

If you do not want your student to participate in the "FREE" Dental Screening, please let your school nurse know, in writing, before the screening date, **DATE**.
